## Speakers and Panelists



Sir Alan Duncan KCMG, Former Foreign Minister and SOAS Board Member

Sir Alan Duncan is a British politician who served as Member of Parliament for Rutland & Melton from 1992 to 2019 and held ministerial roles including Minister of State for International Development (2010-14) and Minister of State for Europe and the Americas (2016-19). Educated at St John's College, Oxford and Harvard University, he began his career in the oil and gas sector before entering politics. He was knighted in 2014 for services to international development and UK-Middle East relations.

Mikey Clark CEO Relode



Mikey Clark is Chief Executive Officer at Relode, a UK-based electricity infrastructure developer building a nationwide network of gigawatt-scale 'Power Parks' to serve the accelerating demand from logistics fleets, ports, data centres and other large-scale industrial users. Formerly co-founder of Pivot Power (now part of EDF Renewables), he led the development of transmission-connected battery storage and electric vehicle charging hubs. His earlier career includes major infrastructure programmes such as the Low Carbon London network initiative and the undergroundiing of high-voltage pylon systems for the London Olympics. Mikey holds a BEng (Hons) in Metallurgy & Materials Engineering from the University of Liverpool.

Professor Tim Evans Middlesex University



Professor Tim Evans is Professor in Business and Political Economy (Practice) at Middlesex University, where he combines interdisciplinary research, doctoral supervision and teaching with direct engagement in public policy, media commentary and impact-driven work across the public, private and third sectors. A highly experienced global commentator, he was formerly Executive Director of Public Affairs at the Independent Healthcare Association (London) and earlier served as Head of the Slovak Prime Minister's Policy Unit, advising government ministers on economic and political reform in Central and Eastern Europe. His academic credentials include a PhD in Sociology and an MSc from the London School of Economics, an MBA from the Open University and a postgraduate certificate in National Security from Christian-Albrechts-Universität Kiel, Germany.

In his current role he champions the commercialisation of Cambridge-born innovation and plays an active part in the UK's venture-capital ecosystem, including co-chairing the UK government's review of university spin-out companies.





Dr Andreas Krieg is Senior Lecturer in the School of Security Studies at King's College London, and a Fellow at the Institute of Middle Eastern Studies. He has lived and worked across the MENA region - notably in Lebanon, Syria, Israel, Palestine, and Qatar - bringing more than a decade of regional experience to his work. His research focuses on non-state actors, surrogate warfare, and the ways that state and non-state entities provide security in the Arab world, with a particular interest in how security provision and socio-political dynamics intersect post-Arab Spring. Dr Krieg also contributes to professional military education through engagement with the UK Defence Academy and the Royal College of Defence Studies, and works as a consultant on geopolitical risk and security in the Gulf.
